- Under the classification of driver's licences in effect in Québec, a holder of a Class 1 licence is authorized to operate all vehicles in classes 2, 3, 44, 84, 5, 5, 60 and 8. There are only two exceptions: classes 6A, 6B and 6C, a separate category of vehicle, namely motorcycles; and class 6D, which does not implicitly include class 8.
- 2. Class 5 holders are automatically licensed to operate vehicles in classes 6D and 8.
- 3. Drivers who obtained their licence prior to July 1978 are automatically entitled to operate a motorcycle, unless they are physically disabled.




### FATALITY RATES PER 10,000 VEHICLES IN USE (QUÉBEC, ONTARIO, CANADA, USA), 1970-2004



The fatality rates per 10,000 vehicles in use show the change in the number of victims involved in accidents as compared to the overall vehicle fleet. Over the 35 years from 1970 through 2004, the rate in Québec, in Ontario, in Canada and in the USA declined.

The improvement is noteworthy in Québec's case. The death rate went from 8.9 in 1970 to 1.24 in 2004. Ontario, which has the lowest rates, shows constant improvement, going from 5 in 1970 to 1.17 in 2003. By comparison, the Canada-wide rate went from 6 in 1970 to 1.47 in 2003, while in the United States, the rate went from roughly 5 in 1970 to 1.81 in 2004\*.

### INJURY RATES PER 10,000 VEHICLES IN USE IN QUÉBEC, ONTARIO, AND CANADA, 1970-2004




The injury rate went from 225 victims per 10,000 vehicles in use in Québec down to 107 from 1970 to 2004. Road accident related-morbidity rates were lower in Québec orver be period from 1970 to 2002 than in Ontario (going from 247 injured to 114 injured). The Canada-wide rate per 10,000 vehicles in use went from 210 injured victims in 1970 to 118 in 2003.

### FATALITY RATES PER 100,000 POPULATION (QUÉBEC, ONTARIO, CANADA, USA), 1970-2004




In the 35 years from 1970 through 2004, the rate of victims killed in road accidents in Québec went from 28 per 100,000 inhabitants in 1970 to 8.6 in 2004, as compared to the United States, where the rate went from 27 deaths to 14.6 over the same period. Ontario had the lowest rates, down from 20 killed per 100,000 inhabitants in 1970 to 6.9 in 2003\*. The rate for Canada as a whole declined roughly from 24 in 1970 to 8.8 in 2007 to 8.8 in 2007.

### Comparison limits

It must be noted that methods used in compiling accident report data vary from one jurisdiction to another, as do definitions. In Québec, a road accident fatality is recorded only if the victim died within eight days of the mishap, while in Ontario the corresponding time allowed is thirty days.

As can be seen, the rates in road accident-related injuries were lower in Québec over the period than in Ontario, except for 2002 and 2003. The rates in Québec varied between 698 and 746 injured victims per 100,000 inhabitants from 1970 to 2003. Ontario's rate went from 995 injured in 1970 to around 636 in 2003. The Canadian rate for 2003 was 703 injured victims per 100,000 population.


