Whether you're a **driver**, **passenger**, **pedestrian**, **cyclist**, **moped rider** or **motorcyclist**, do you know that you are covered if you're injured in a traffic accident anywhere in the world?

Thanks to the protection **Québec's public automobile insurance plan** provides, all Quebecers are insured, regardless of fault.

Who handles compensation?

- If you are injured, it is the SAAQ.
- If the vehicle is damaged, it is your private insurance company.

Look out, it's red!

If you're **meeting or following** a school bus with its red lights flashing or stop sign extended, what must you do?

You are required to stop your vehicle at least **5 metres** away from the bus.

Should you fail to stop your vehicle or pass a school bus with its red lights flashing or stop sign extended, you are liable:

- for a fine between \$200 and \$300 and
- to have 9 demerit points entered on your driving record.

DID YOU KNOW THAT?

If the roadway is separated by a median, you are not required to stop your vehicle when meeting a school bus with its red lights flashing or stop sign extended.





Are you pulling a trailer?

Do it safely, ensure that:

 the coupling system and safety chains are in good condition, firmly attached and used correctly;

 your vehicle and trailer are in good operating condition and have been inspected by a professional.



Slow down!

Speeding vehicles kill more than 150 people each year and injure some 7,000 others. On the road, before accelerating, think about it!

Will be soon be turning 75?

As a driver's licence holder, you must undergo a medical and vision examination at age 75, at 80 and then every two years thereafter.


Demerit points

How many demerit points could be entered on your driving record if you fail to bring your vehicle to a stop at a stop sign?

ANSWER: 3 POINTS

Remember:

Those points remain on your driving record **for 2 years**.



How does your child measure up?

Measured from the buttocks to the top of the head in a sitting position,


- if your child comes in under 63 cm:
 he/she must be placed in a safety seat,
 suitable in terms of your child's height
 and weight, on the rear seat of your
 vehicle:
- if your child is at least 63 cm in height: he/she must be restrained by one of the seat belts on your vehicle's rear seat.


Don't forget to mesure your child regularly.



- · Remain calm;
- Be prepared to act if a tailgater decides to overtake your vehicle on a hazardous stretch of the road;
- As soon as the situation permits, slow down and allow the driver to pass.








Do you know the difference between these two signs?

- A First sign indicates that the left lane merges with the right lane and second sign indicates that the far left lane merges with the middle lane.
- First sign indicates that the road narrows without the loss of a lane and second sign indicates the loss of a lane.
- There is no difference; both signs indicate that the roadway narrows from two lanes to one.
