Highway carrier enforcement officers

If you are a motorist, a highway controller can stop you if:

- you are carrying hazardous materials, equipment or goods (gas, petroleum products, explosives, flammable material, corrosive agents, poisons or infectious substances, etc.);
- your vehicle is in poor mechanical condition;
- your vehicle is overloaded or too wide or too long or if the material you are carrying is not properly tied down;
- you commit a Criminal Code offence, such as:
 - impaired driving;
 - dangerous driving;
 - hit-and-run:
 - fail to stop your vehicle and provide assistance when an accident occurs;
- you are driving a vehicle or combination of vehicles weighing 3,000 kg and over, a minibus or tow truck.

Remember, Contrôle routier Québec contributes to improving highway safety!



Demerit Points

How many demerit points could be entered on your driving record if you accelerate when a vehicle is trying to pass you?

Those points remain on your driving record for 2 years.

Covered Anywhere in the World



Whether you're a driver, passenger, pedestrian, cyclist, moped rider or motorcyclist, you are covered if you're injured in a traffic accident anywhere in the world.

Thanks to the protection **Québec's Public Automobile Insurance Plan** provides, all Quebecers are insured, regardless of fault.

Who handles compensation?

- If you are injured, it is the SAAQ.
- If the vehicle is damaged, it is your private insurance company.

Speedy?

Could it be that your **impatience** and the **stress** brought on by today's hectic pace carry over when you get at the controls of a vehicle? If so, your driving could be influenced and take you over the speed limit.



A clear view, a question of safety!

Did you know that tinting of a vehicle's windows on either side of the driver is **prohibited** if less than 70% of light (as measure by a photometer) can filter through?

Automobile windows are already tinted by the manufacturer when a vehicle rolls off the assembly line. Should you add a tint to the windows, less than 70% of light may be getting through, and your safety would be at risk. If light transmittance is less than 70%, you will be liable for a minimum fine of \$100.

If there is any doubt, the law allows a police officer to issue an **inspection notice**. This notice will require you to go to a mechanical inspection agent certified by the SAAQ, to determine if your vehicle windows comply with safety standards.



QUICK'N EASY! Go to www.saaq.gouv.qc.ca to conduct these operations online:

- have your change of address recorded;
- make, change, check or cancel an appointment for a driving test - knowledge or road test;
- pay for renewal (if you are a member of the Caisses Desigrdins or a client of the National Bank of Canada) of your:
 - driver's licence:
 - vehicle registration;
 - disabled parking permit;

- check the validity of a driver's licence;
- check if a vehicle can be licensed;
- get a copy of your driving record;
- get a copy of your compensation record;
- notify us of storage of your vehicle;
- have your vehicle removed from storage and licensed for road use;
- notify us of vehicle discarding.

DID YOU KNOW THAT...?

- In the event vehicle passengers under age 16 fail to wear their seat belt, the driver will be the one fined and have 3 demerit points entered on his or her record.
- · At an intersection, drivers must yield to a pedestrian facing a green traffic light, whether or not there is a walk signal.
 - · You can donate your car to The Kidney Foundation of Canada's Kidney-Car Program. To find the Kidney-Car number for

your region call: 1 888 228-8673; or go to www.kidneyquebec.ca.

- To use a parking space reserved for the disabled, you must hold a parking permit issued by the SAAQ.
- · Under the Criminal Code, driving while under the influence of a drug results in the same penalties as alcoholimpaired driving.
- When drivers turn age 75, they must undergo a medical and vision examination, then again at age 80 and every two years afterward. The SAAQ will contact you in that event.




Before starting the engine...

Always clear snow and ice from the windows, roof and hood of your vehicle.

DID YOU KNOW THAT ...?

Windshield wiper sprayers can freeze while your vehicle is parked and then block. To prevent melted snow from turning into ice, turn on the sprayers once or twice before turning off the engine.



tnink about it!

For safety's sake,

- 1. Stop your vehicle in a safe place;
- 2. Turn on the hazard lights;
- 3. Avoid leaving the vehicle, remain calm and wait for help;
- 4. Avoid exposure to the cold;
- 5. Turn on the engine and heating system, 10 minutes every hour, making sure the hazard lights and exhaust pipe are clear;
- 6. When the engine is on, lower your window a little to avoid carbon monoxide poisoning.
- 7. Protect yourself to avoid hypothermia, i.e. a lowering of the body temperature below its normal temperature.



DID YOU KNOW THAT ...?

If you're stuck for quite a while, move about to keep from falling asleep. Intense cold and sleep can bring on hypothermia and lead to death.
